



SERVICE ANIMAL AND PET POLICY

CAN ANIMALS RIDE THE TROLLEY?

Service Animals may board the Trolley.

- A service animal is defined as any guide dog, signal dog, or other animal individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability.
- The service animal must be harnessed or leashed (ropes or belts do not qualify as leashes).
- The driver may ask the rider if the animal is a service animal and what task the animal has been trained to perform.

Small pets in carriers may board the Trolley.

- Only small pets, weighing under 10 lbs., in enclosed pet carriers may board the trolley. The pet carrier must be placed on the floor under the seat while riding.
- Non-service animals may not board the trolley, unless in a carrier.

SERVICE ANIMAL & PET POLICY

- The rider and any animal may be removed or excluded from the trolley if the animal is out of control and the rider cannot take actions to control the animal, or if the animal poses a direct threat to the health or safety of others.
- The rider and any animal may be removed or excluded from the trolley if the animal is not housebroken.
- The rider taking an animal onboard is liable for any and all damage that may be caused by the animal to the Interurban Trolley.
